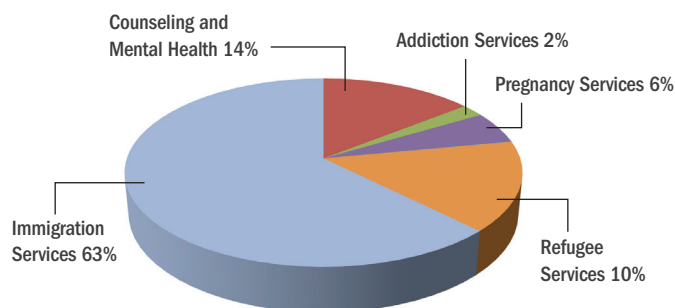

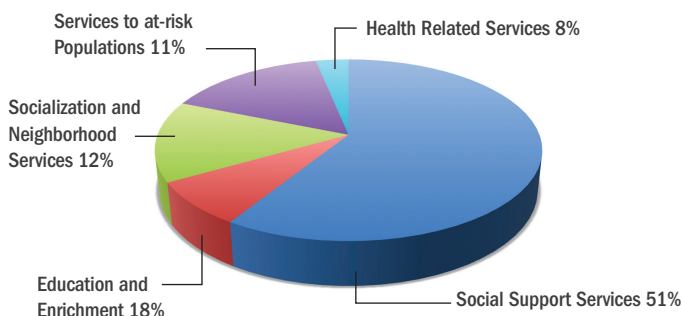

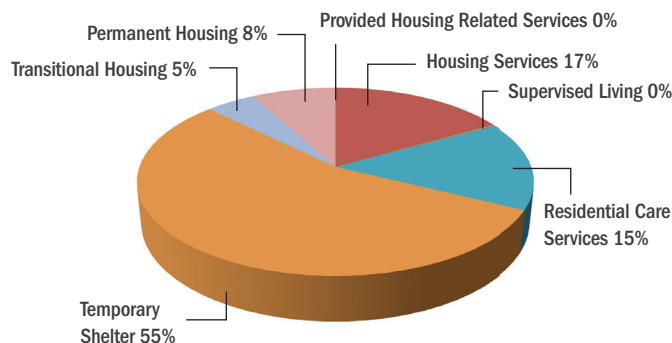

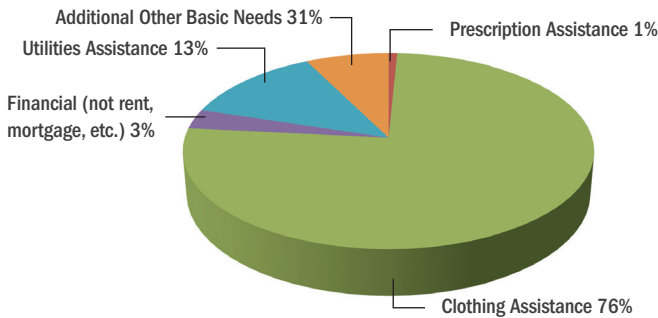
## Catholic Charities Personnel and Finances

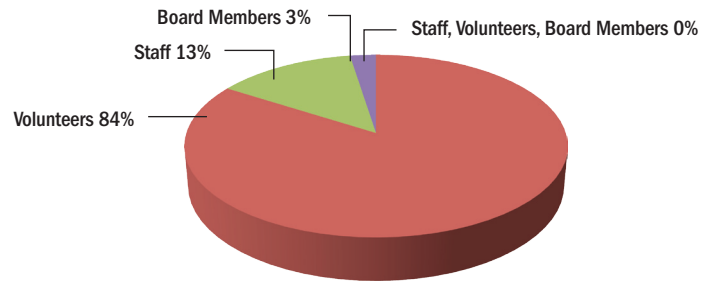

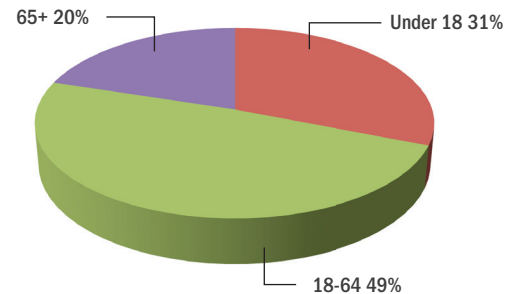
