

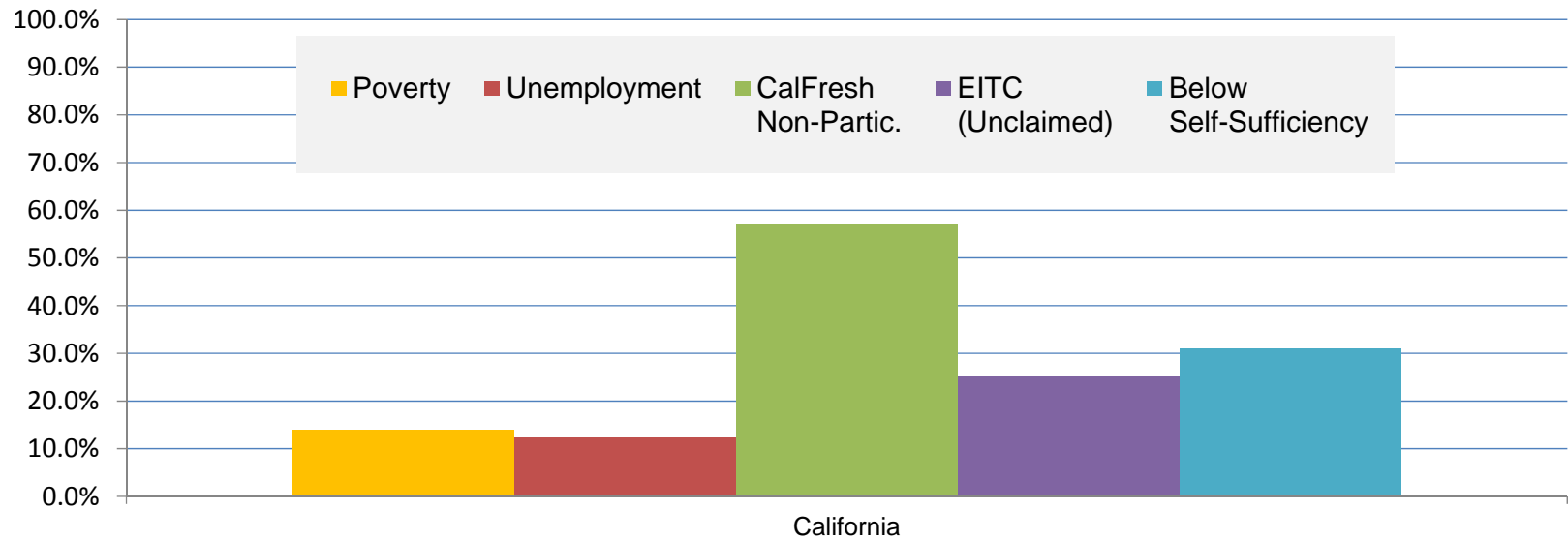

The tables below provide the following data for each county in California, grouped by local Catholic Charities Agency:

Total population:	Estimates of population by county and statewide for July 2009. (U.S. Census Bureau)
Living below the federal poverty line:	This statistic is defined as the number of people with income at or below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines in 2009. (U.S. Census Bureau)
Unemployed:	The number and percent of people in California who were unemployed as of December 2010, out of the total Civilian Labor Force (N = 18.1 million, statewide). (California Employment Development Division)
Eligible for CalFresh but not participating:	2010 estimate of the number of individuals who are income eligible but not participating in CalFresh, calculated according to the formula below. (California Food Policy Advocates) $(\# \text{ of Income-Eligible Individuals}) - (\text{Monthly Average of Individuals Participating in CalFresh}) = \# \text{ of Income-Eligible Non-Participants}$ <i>* Percent is calculated as non-participating eligibles out of total eligibles.</i>
Eligible for EITC but not receiving:	Number of tax returns eligible for EITC but not receiving; based on EITC Payments to California Residents, and Estimated Unclaimed EITC Payments, by County and Selected Cities (2006). (IRS) <i>* Percent is calculated as non-participating eligibles out of total eligibles. Total eligibles is calculated as EITC returns plus estimated unclaimed EITC returns.</i>
Cost of Living	Number and percent of households below the self-sufficiency standard. The self-sufficiency standard is a county-by-county measure of the cost of living; households below this standard do not have sufficient income to cover basic expenses like childcare, transportation, health care, and food.

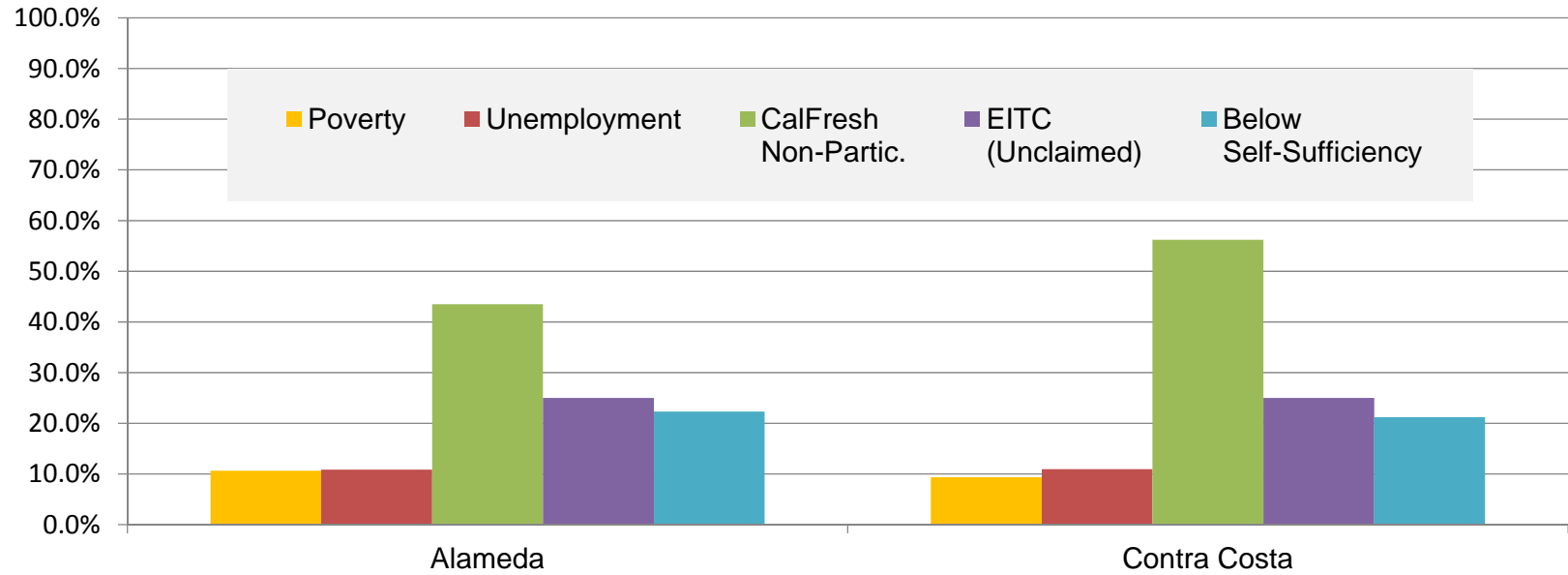
